



Malinee Laopaiboon is a Professor at the Department of Biostatistics and Demography, Faculty of Public Health, Khon Kaen University, Khon Kaen, Thailand. Malinee has a doctorate from Free University, Berlin, Germany and further qualifications from Michigan University, USA, Reading University, UK and the National Perinatal Epidemiology Unit, Oxford University, UK.

Malinee has working experiences in designing and undertaking the statistical analysis on a range of other national and international clinical and community projects. Malinee has been responsible for the data management and analysis for some multicentre trials and observational studies for WHO Reproductive Health and Research Department since 2004.

Currently Malinee is a Co-Country Chief Investigators for the SEA-URCHIN: South East Asia – Using Research for Change in Hospital-acquired Infection in Neonates, a 5 years project of 2011-16. Malinee is an investigator of the systematic review of ‘Global, regional and national levels and trends in preterm birth for 1990 to 2013’, a project for WHO Reproductive Health and Research Department.

Malinee has published widely in the national and international literature and is an extremely respected biostatistician with many years of experience in analysis of clinical data, particularly in maternal and perinatal fields. Malinee has been a Cochrane reviewer in several topics of systematic reviews and meta analyses, and published more than 30 reviews in the Cochrane library. Malinee has also joined the Cochrane Thailand in training and facilitating Thai and some other Asian reviewers to do Cochrane systematic reviews since 2002. Malinee is also a member of the Cochrane training working group and author forum.
